The Irish Literary Society. RECOLLECTIONS OF ITS EARLY DAYS.

In many of the obituary notices of the late Mr. Laurence Ginnell he is set down as being one of the founders of the Irish Literary Society...

To the best of my recollection Mr. Ginnell was not even an original member. The Society grew out of the Southwark Irish Literary Society, which had its rooms in Bath street...
